

We have also made some E-safety posters to go in the year 2 classrooms as we want to have year 2 E-safety ambassadors.

Theme Menu – There will be no theme lunch day in December due to Christmas dinner. Theme menus will return in January.

Sickness – There is no longer a need for children to be off for 48 hours after they have been sick. Children can return to school when they are well enough.

Bumped Heads – We will now be making a phone call home whenever a child has bumped their head during school time. This is our new standard practice. Nearly all bumped heads do not need any further medical

attention. However, to err on the side of caution, it is best practise to inform parents so they can look out for any signs of after effects. Although we fill out an accident form, these can sometimes sit in a book bag and not been seen on the same day that the bump took place.



The Friends of Waycroft are holding their Christmas themed Mufti day on Friday 8th December. In return for coming to school in non-uniform we ask Nursery, Reception and KS1 children to bring in donations of chocolate and KS2 children to donate a bottle; alcoholic or non-alcoholic.
