BLP Focus – Planning (linked to Reflectiveness)

This means thinking about: where you are going; the action you are going to take; the time and resources you will need and the obstacles you will face for a task. Over the next two weeks can you show good planning when carrying

out a task at home by:

- -Looking in the fridge/freezer, can you plan dinner for the next evening/week
- -Planning a day out/walk for your family
- -Writing instructions for a member of family to follow e.g. to make a cup of tea
