Welcome back to Waycroft for the 2018-19 academic year. The beginning of term is an exciting time and it is good to report that all classes are well settled and enjoying starting their new topics with their new teachers. I would like to welcome all of our new families to Waycroft. It is lovely to have you and your children in our school. We are looking forward to an interesting and successful first term. If you have any questions please ask.

Secondary School Applications – Y6 parents/carers please keep an eye out for information regarding applying for secondary schools. The deadline is often about 31st October.

Primary School Applications – For those children who will be starting Reception in September 2019, parents and carers need to apply



online when the website is live. We have an open day for any prospective parents that would like to view the school on Tuesday 27th November. Please book a place with our office staff if you would like to attend. We will be doing three separate tours of the school at 9am, 11am and 2pm. There will be crèche facilities available in the library as the tour is not appropriate for children. These tours are also for those parents who would like to view our nursery facilities for our September 2019 intake.

Pink Box –The pink box in the office is for you to return any reply slips, letters and notes to teachers/the office when you do not need to speak to someone. Please do not leave any money in the box. The box is to try and reduce the amount of parents queuing at the hatch each morning and will help us to help you sooner.

Key personnel you may need to speak to:

If you come into our main school office, you will be greeted by either Miss Pople or Mrs Norfolk who are happy to help you with any queries, passing on information or to set up a meeting with another member of staff.

We do have a new Family Link Worker, Mrs Trickey, who has started with us in September. Mrs Trickey will be leading on our whole school attendance strategy, will support children directly emotionally in school and is available to provide family support such as if you have concerns about children's behaviour at home, managing children's anxiety or even someone to talk to if you are going through a difficult time. There are a number of agencies and support networks available in the Bristol area that may be helpful to our families and Mrs Trickey will help you with referrals as needed.

The class teachers are available for meetings/conversations around their teaching commitments. For the early years and KS1, please catch the teacher at drop off/pick up to arrange a mutually agreeable time or via the school office. For key stage 2, you can catch them at the end of the day or via the school office.

If there is an on-going worry that you haven't been able to resolve with the class teacher, the **phase leaders** are also able to meet with you.

As a school, we want all families to feel confident to come in and speak to us about anything. I can assure you that between us we have a vast amount of experience supporting children and their families and no conversation is too big or too small.

Parentmail – A huge thank you to all our new Reception & Nursery parents who have created their parentmail accounts. This makes communicating with our parents a lot easier as well as reducing our paper and photocopying overheads. We will shortly be asking our second group of new nursery parents to create their accounts too. You will be sent a registration email over the coming days (providing you gave us your email address on your child's application form). Once registered, please download the parentmail pmx app which allows notifications to come straight through to your phone. Changes to the school office – Please be aware there have been some changes in our school office. There are now only two in the main office rather than four. The rest of the administration team are now based in the offices across the car park (previously the caretaker's bungalow) as their roles cover the whole multi academy trust and are not Waycroft specific. Please can you help our office team by checking newsletters and the website for dates and key information before phoning the office and be aware that we will not be phoning home routinely when children have forgotten something. Children need to make sure they have their homework books, PE kits, instruments and after school club equipment on the appropriate days. We do have a small collection of spare PE kit that children will borrow if they forget their kit.

A little thank you to all of the parents/carers for their patience and support this morning during the school drop off time. It was great to see parents, carers and children being supportive of each other whilst the fire alarm sounded.

Attendance & Lateness - Our whole school target this year is 97%. Attendance will continue to be a focus for our school this year. Our attendance is below what is expected of us by the government and poor attendance also has a detrimental effect on your child's learning. Please make sure your child is in school and on time. Any child arriving in class after 9am is given a late mark and after 9.20am is given an unauthorised absence. The school gates open at 8.45am for the children to enter school.

If you need to request time off school you must fill in a Leave of Absence Request form. These are available from the office. As per last year, we will continue to be tough on holidays in line with our attendance policy and it is unlikely any holidays will be authorised, even if it includes visiting unwell family or family weddings, as children do get 13 weeks school holidays spread over the year. Leave of absence must be exceptional to be authorised.
