Waycroft Academy uses Building Learning Power to give children the skills to become excellent learners. What is Building Learning Power? Building Learning Power or 'BLP' is based on the work of Professor Guy Claxton. Firmly rooted in science and research it suggests that there are several broad dispositions that we need to develop in order to become successful lifelong learners. We need to provide our children with the capacity to meet the unknown challenges of the twenty first century. The notion of giving them 'portable learning power' so that they are able to rise to these challenges is at the heart of BLP. In some of our newsletters we will be setting a family BLP 'challenge' linked to one our BLP muscles to help families familiarise themselves with the terminology and engage in learning to learn activities together. BLP Focus - Imagining (Linked to Resourcefulness)

This means you use your imagination to picture how things might look, feel, sound and be. Over the next two weeks can you use imagining when carrying out a task at home by:

-Finding an object at home and discuss what it could be used for. What happens if you add another object, can you use them together to do something creative?

-Writing an opening line to a short story. Pass the

paper on and get a family member to write the next line. Keep passing the paper until the story is finished. -Creating a play to act out as a family.
